DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. **Read Isaiah 9: 6.** Why do we need a *wonderful* counselor? Have you ever received “*not-so-wonderful*” counsel?
2. We know now that the Wonderful Counselor is Jesus. Pastor Bill described him as one who would offer ASTOUNDING WISDOM. How do these scriptures describe Jesus’ wisdom? **Matthew 7:28-29, 1 Corinthians 1:24, 1 Corinthians 1:30, Ephesians 1:17**
3. Read the following scriptures as if Jesus is your Wonderful Counselor. What great wisdom is He giving you?
 - **Read John 16:33, Matthew 9:2, John 8:36, Matthew 11:30, 2 Corinthians 12:9, John 15:5, Matthew 19:26, Proverbs 3:5-6**
4. In order to experience Jesus as Wonderful Counselor in our lives, we need to *spend time in His Word*. **Read Psalm 119:105**
 - Is it difficult to find time to read the Word or is it a daily routine? Share some of the ways that you make it a priority.
5. In order to experience Jesus as Wonderful Counselor in our lives, we need to listen for His voice speaking through other believers.
 - **Read Hebrews 10:24-25.** How are we to counsel one another? Why is it so important that we continue to meet together?
 - What kind of warning do we see in **Colossians 2:8**.
6. In order to experience Jesus as Wonderful Counselor in our lives, we need to seek His counsel in prayer.
 - **Read 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18.** Why is it easier sometimes to go to Google or call someone before we go to God?
